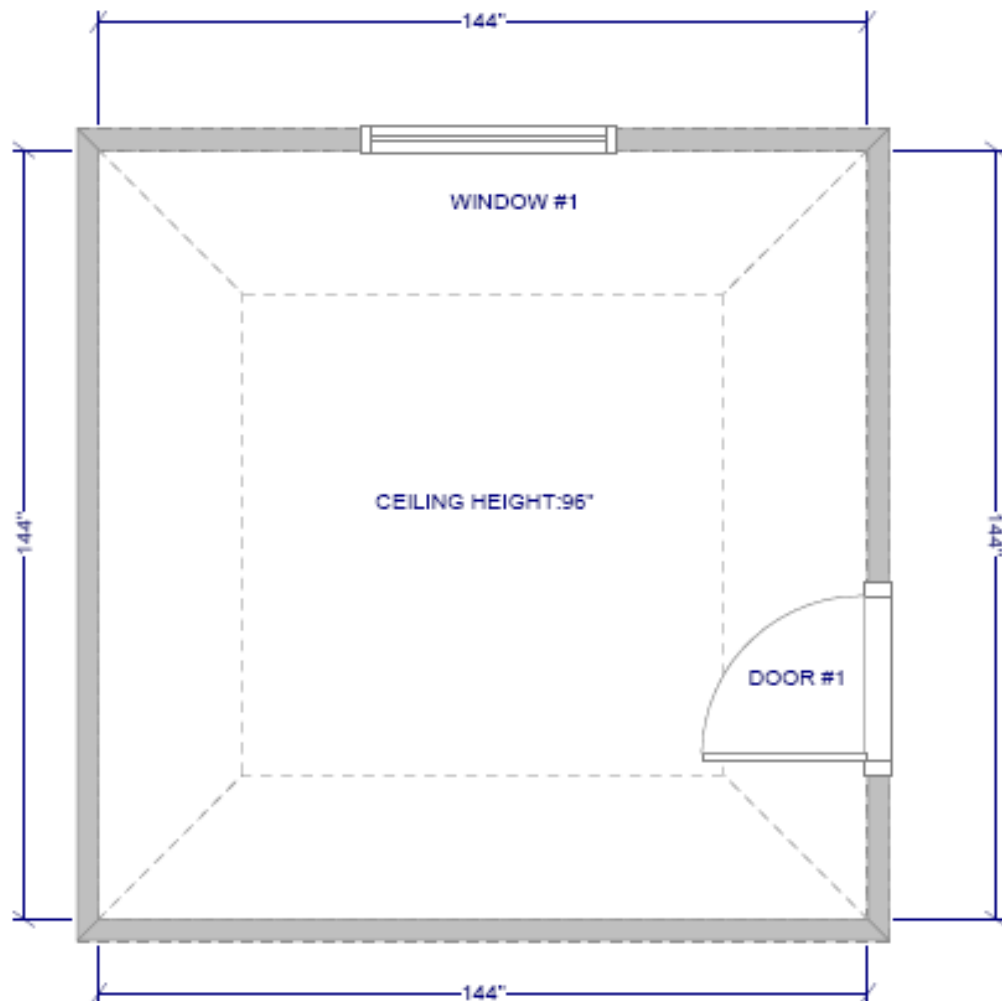


Measure Your Kitchen in 4 Easy Steps

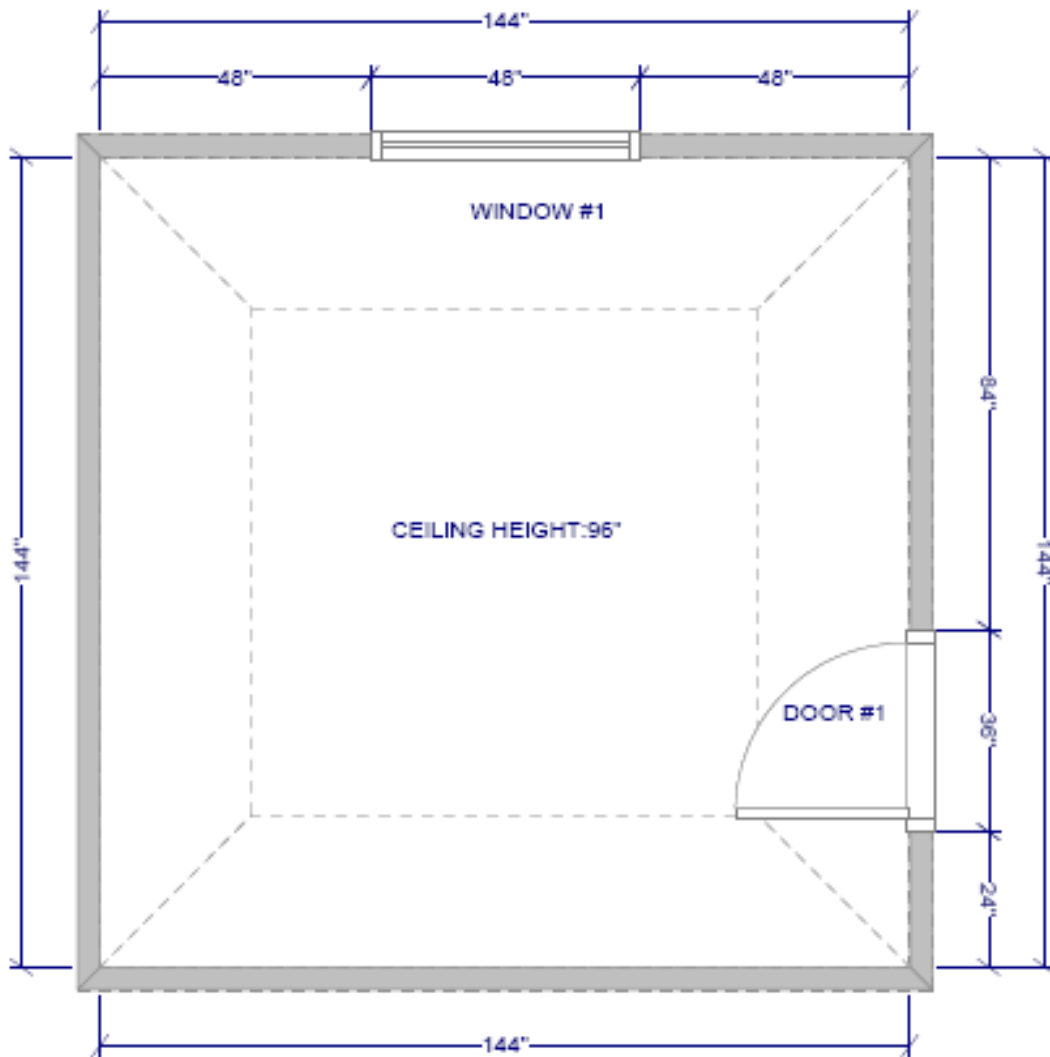
1. Overall Room

- Make a rough sketch of the entire kitchen showing any windows, doors or openings.
- Measure each overall wall length.
- Measure the height of the ceiling. Ceiling heights, even in the same room, can sometimes vary by as much as several inches. If it varies, write down both the low and high measurements.



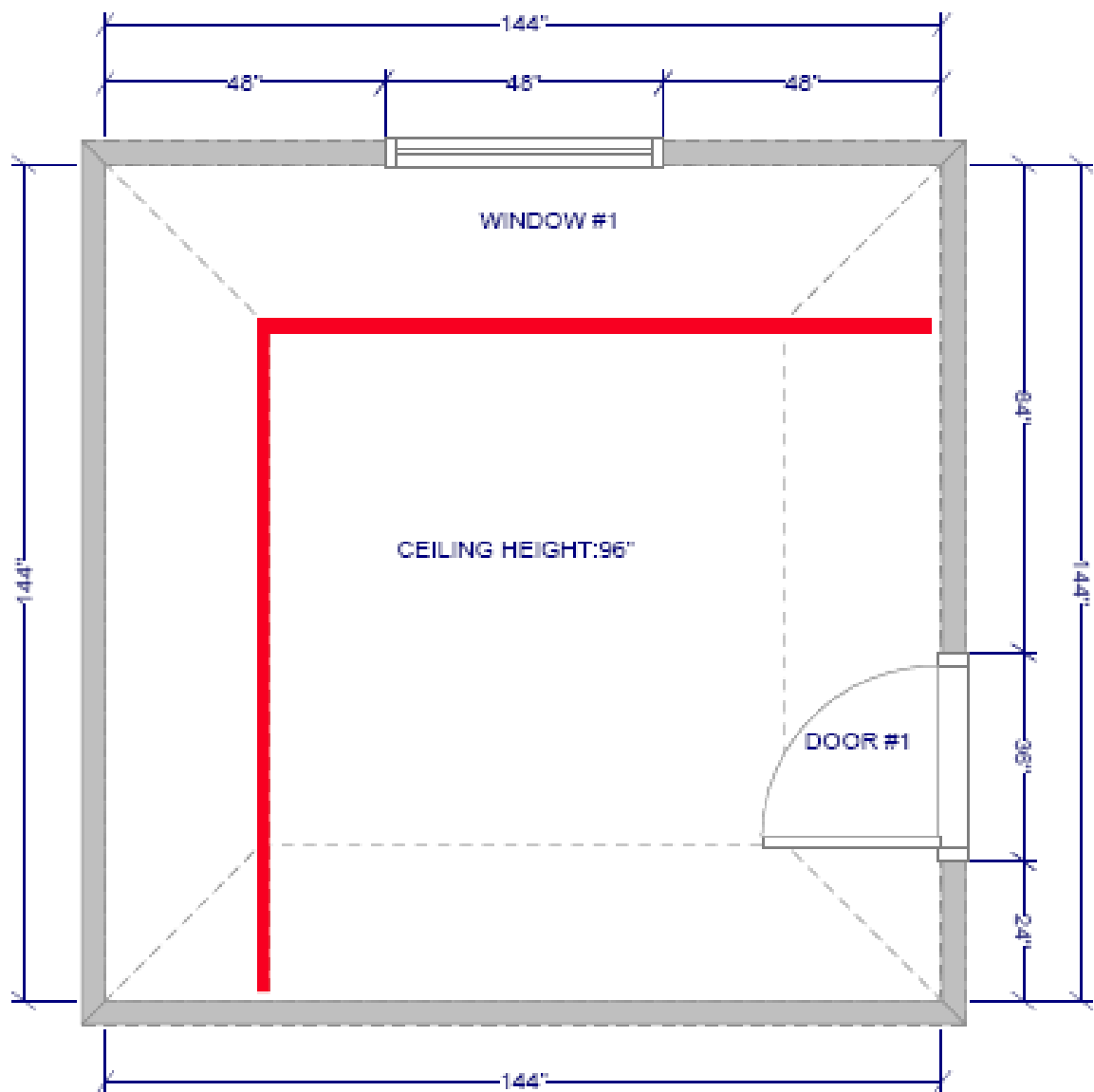
2. Wall Sections / Doors / Windows

- Measure from each wall corner to edge of window, door or opening beginning at the top left corner of your drawing. Continue clockwise around the room until each wall, window and door has been measured. Label the windows and doors "Window #1", "Window #2", "Door #1", "Door #2".
- Measure across each door, window or opening from outside trim edge to edge.
- When measuring doors and windows the trim is considered part of the door or window. Measure from the outside of the trim on one side to the outside of the trim on the other side, then from the outside of the trim to the middle of the window or door.
- To double check your work, the sum of each section should equal the total overall wall length.



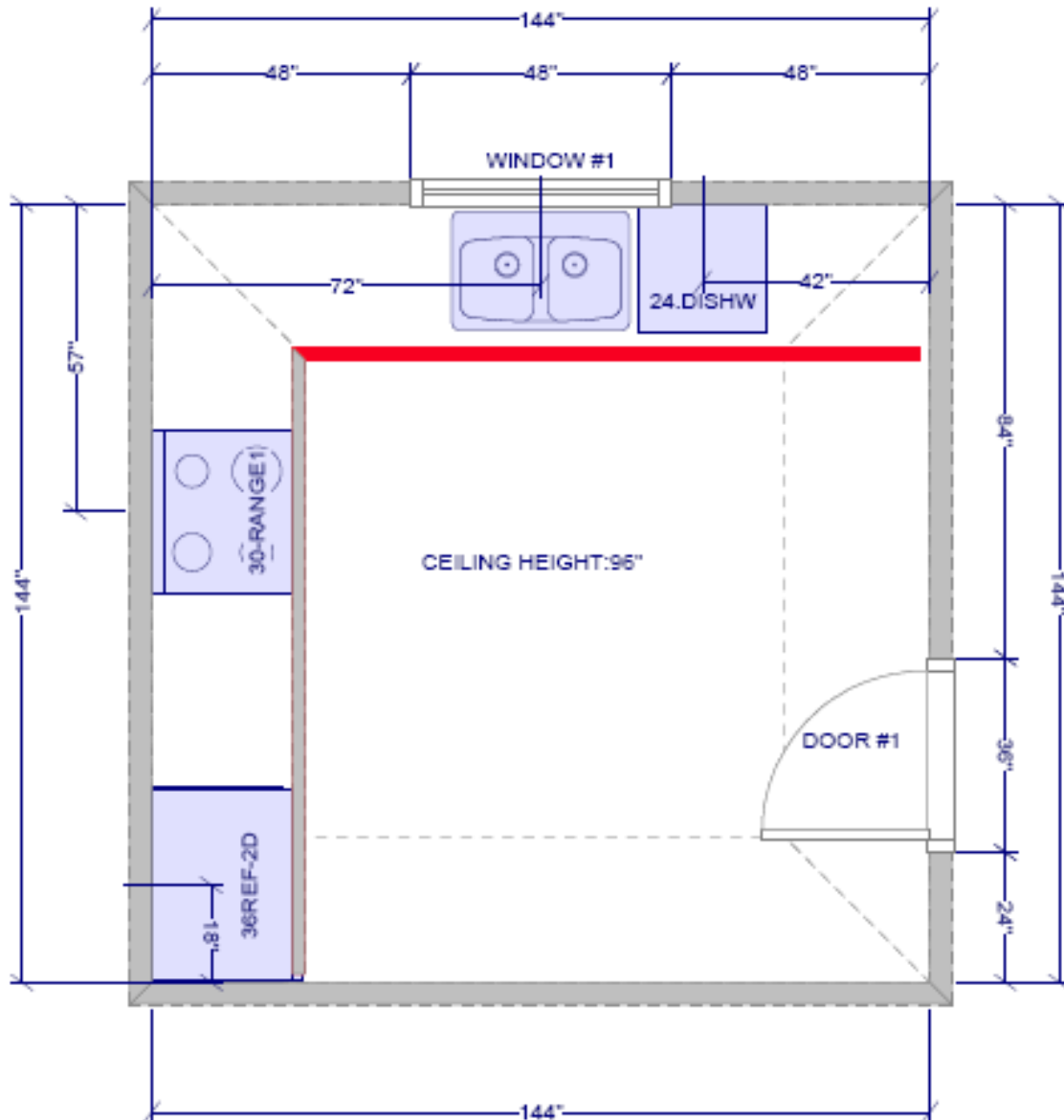
3. Cabinet Areas

- Highlight locations where you would like your cabinets to go.



4. Appliances (Stove, Refrigerator) / Obstructions (Pipes, Radiators, Plumbing, Soffits)

- Show desired locations of appliances and obstructions on the drawing. Please identify what type, e.g. label Range, Sink, Dishwasher.
- Do not put down appliances or obstructions which will be removed or replaced.
- If the appliances are remaining in the same location, document the distance from the wall to the center of the appliance as shown between points 1 to 2, 1 to 3, 1 to 4 and 1 to 5.
- In the chart below, please write the width, height, and depth in inches of the appliances you will use in your new kitchen. If you don't know them, it's ok, appliances are generally standard dimensions.
- If the appliance or obstruction is not in contact with the floor, measure from the floor to the bottom of the obstruction or appliance.
